Venturing Awards and Recognition Program

Encourage your Venturing crew members to work towards the completion of one of the Venturing awards. The process of working towards the awards will help keep youth interested in Venturing.

Silver Award

Venturers must be proficient in emergency preparedness (including standard first aid, CPR, and Defense), Safe Swim participate in Ethics in Action. complete Venturina the Leadership Skills Course. earn the Venturing Gold Award, and earn at least one of the five Venturing Bronze awards.

Nicole comes to us from Des Plaines Valley Council and is a resident of Brookfield, Illinois. She graduated from Riverside-Brookfield High School in Brookfield, Illinois. She currently attends Marquette University in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, seeking degrees in Broadcast/ Electronic Communication and Politics, with the intent of working in the news media upon graduation.

In high school, Nicole was active in her local church youth group and participated in several national youth conferences. She also was active in the school's television station. She produced, directed, wrote, and edited many segments for the station as well as serving as an anchor. Her work was awarded the Chicago land High School Video Festival Bronze Award. In addition to her achievements with the school's television station, Nicole is a member of the National Honor Society. In 2005, she was named Riverside-Brookfield High School's Citizen of the Year. She also received the Presidential Award for Excellence and Departmental Honors for Library and Instructional Technology.

Nicole began her Scouting career as a Girl Scout. After becoming a Venturer, Nicole served as secretary and vice-president to her own crew, as well as vice-president and president of the Des Plaines Valley Council's Venturing Leadership Council. Due to her dedication and leadership qualities, she was awarded the Venturing Leadership Award in 2004.



A Venturing Summary of the Simon Kenton Council Recognition Dinner/Overnight November 3rd-4th, 2007 Columbus, Ohio



Starting at 6pm on Saturday night, the Simon Kenton Council started their annual Recognition Dinner and Overnight.

This year they had the Central Region Venturing President, the Area 4 Venturing President, and the Area 4 Vice President in attendance along with many Venturers and Sea Scouts from their council.

After a very good dinner, we moved into the other room where there were over 40 BSA uniforms from around the world that Venturers tried to identify as part of a celebration for the 100th year of scouting.

We then presented a silver award and recognized those who had earned many of the other Venturing awards. We ended the recognition ceremony with a Woodbadge ceremony, and the presentation of 6 Council Venturing Leadership Awards.

Also presented was the Central Region's first Council Standards of Venturing Excellence certificate to the Simon Kenton council's Scout Executive.

The youth and some adults then headed to an all night lock in at the local fitness center in Easton, Ohio. There they enjoyed a swimming pool, rock walls, and many other fun activities.

How to Elect Crew Officers

Elections for crew officers can happen anytime the crew determines is the right time to do so. This is usually specified in the crew bylaws. Many crews follow the calendar year, holding elections in January. Many others follow the school year with elections in the fall.

Certain election procedures must be followed when your crew holds its regular election.

- 1. Your Advisor informs the crew of the responsibilities and job description of each office and stresses the need for commitment to the goals of the crew and attendance at all meetings. This is a great time to review your mission statement.
- 2. Your current President explains the procedures and the date of the election, and appoints a nominating committee. The nominating committee should be 3 or more crew members and an associate advisor. The nominating committee is important because the committee takes the time to be sure that the nominees are willing and able to serve. Those nominated should understand and commit to the responsibilities and time involved.
- 3. The nominating committee interviews those crew members interested in running for office and contacts others they think should be considered for the positions.
- 4. On election day:
 - The president asks the nominating committee for the slate of candidates.
 - Crew members are invited to make additional nominations.
 - If the nominations are seconded and the nominees agree to serve, their names are added to the ballot.
 - Nominations are closed by a majority vote
 - Each nominee is invited to give a short talk; crew members may ask questions.
 - Voting takes place.

- If only one nominee for an office, the president requests a motion to approve the nominee by acclamation.
- If two or more nominees per office, voting is done by secret ballot. The nominee receiving the most votes is elected. If a tie, the two with the most votes are voted on again.
- The newly elected officers are congratulated and an installation ceremony may be conducted.
- Right after the election, the Advisor and the new officers schedule a crew officers briefing & orientation.

Things to consider:

- How long do your crew officers serve?
- What kind of training will you provide for your crew officers?
- How are responsibilities divided among the officers?
- When is the best time of year for your crew to hold elections?



Also,

- Set expectations for officers to take their responsibilities seriously
- Have the crew officers help teach the Venturing Leadership Skills Course
- For many youth this is their first real "hands on" leadership opportunity.
- Small crews should follow these procedures as well.
