William I. Koch International Sea Scout Cup

Last year's William I Koch International Sea Scout Cup was held in Annapolis, Maryland at the United States Naval Academy. The event was held July 13th – 19 and is a biennial event. This was the fourth time that the race was held but the first time it was hosted at USNA. This regatta is open to youth between the ages of 14-21. Participants must be registered and active in the Sea Scout program. The sailors are divided into two fleets, the Koch fleet consists of the more experienced sailors and the second fleet sails for the Kiwi fleet. Both trophies are on display at the Boy Scout Museum in Irving, Texas. William I. Koch, who won the America's Cup in 1992, agreed to revive the national sailing cup in 2002, if the race involved International Sea Scouts and provided for a truly competitive racing event. General Motors helps sponsor this race also.

Participants were also able to spend a day touring Washington, D.C.



The teams consisted of youth from twelve States and from eight visiting countries. Each team consists of a skipper and one crew member. The teams raced on Vanguard 420s and FJ's provided by the Academy. Winds were light for most of the week but built up to at least 12 knots by Thursday. This year's winner was Patrick Arrington, of Pinecrest, Florida who was awarded the silver trophy at the closing ceremonies held at Annapolis Yacht Club. Arrington is a member of the Sea Scout Ship 1946 in Coconut Grove, FL. He was able to defeat the winning streak of the Del Mar Ship from Newport Beach, CA. The winners of the Kiwi Fleet are Eric Johnson of Mercer Island and Levi White of La Conner, Washington. The Chevrolet Sportsmanship Awards were presented to Monica and Ryan Orphan, of Woodland Hills, CA and Franklin Simmons and Gary Burner of Akron, OH.

The Venturing **Gold Award** program recognizes significant accomplishment in a Venturer's life as he or she has proven outstanding performance in a broad spectrum of activities. These activities relate to Venturing's six experience areas of leadership, citizenship, social, outdoor, service, and fitness. It challenges Venturers over an extended period by offering challenging and stimulating opportunities for Venturers to develop and achieve personal goals in the areas of leadership, character development, and personal fitness.



The Bronze Award is the first step towards the Venturing Silver Award. The five different Venturing programs (Arts and Hobbies, Outdoor, Sea Scouting, Sports, and Youth Ministries)

The **Ranger Award** exemplifies a challenging high-level outdoor/high-adventure skills advancement program. Once earned, it will identify a Ranger as a person who is highly skilled at a variety of outdoor sports and interests, trained in outdoor safety, and ready to lead or assist others in activities.

As this provides for cross-over (i.e. Sea Scout Organization / Venture Organization) and for upward mobility on the area and regional youth level (Boatswain's Mate to Boatswain). The inclusion of the Petty officers in Boatswain and Boatswain's Mate positions at area and regional level will hopefully give us more input will less stress on the time constraints of our youth officers.

The Boatswain's Mate (administration) could help to maintain area and regional communications with Squadrons and Ships youth officers. The Boatswain's Mate (Program) could help to maintain area and regional communications with Sea Scouts and Ships working on SEAL, ORT challenges, advancement, and youth officers in Jr. Staff positions (i.e. Petty Officer in Charge). The Central Region will be awarding a Flagship for the ship that meets the requirements of the Regional Flagship Award. This is similar to the National Award and will be awarded to the top ship in our region, or the runner up if a ship earns the National award. This award application form can be found soon on the Central Region Sea Scout website and the Yahoo! Group.

Long Cruise Plans

Do you have plans for cruise weekends of a long cruise (14 days)? Do you have space for qualified Sea Scouts to join the cruise? Ships with out vessels or great waters may wish to join you. Contact skipper_mac@yahoo.com and see if we can share resources to the benefit of CR Sea Scouts.



1. A Sea Scout must be at least Ordinary rank before he or she can start recording cruising time for the Long Cruise Badge.
2. In order to qualify for this badge, the Sea Scout must have cruised two weeks on any vessel or boat provided by the local council or ship, or their own vessel when authorized by an adult leader in that Sea Scout Ship. Each additional long cruise badge is marked by a red arc above the badge, until five such cruises have been completed. Then a single white arc replaces them above the badge.
3. In the event that it is not possible to make a two week cruise, a series of weekend or overnight cruises on any boat or ship may be made, provided that the total number equals fourteen days. (*Note: An overnight cruise lasts two days; a weekend cruise starting on Saturday and ending on Monday, will be counted as three days.*)
4. There is no requirement regarding distance and number of miles.
5. The Long Cruise badge is an achievement, not a rank; therefore, an adult leader may qualify for the badge without qualifying for the Ordinary rank.

Youth Leadership 2009-10

Area or Regional Boatswain position application and selection procedure

QUALIFICATIONS:

Sea Scout must:

1. Be a high school junior, senior, or college freshman and hold at least the rank of Ordinary.
2. Be under 21 years of age on December 31, of the service year.
3. Be a present or past senior youth leader in his/her Ship (i.e. Boatswain or Boatswain's Mate) or council Wardroom/Quarterdeck/VPA/VOA.
4. Be an active Sea Scout for the immediate past two years and currently active in a Sea Scout Ship.
5. Be recommended and approved by his/her Skipper.
6. Be recommended and approved by his/her council.

Experience:

Experience as the ship, council, and/or Area Boatswain.

Leadership experience, awards, training, and other activities related to Sea Scouting and Venturing.

Honors, leadership positions, awards, training from Scouting, church, or other organizations.

School awards, clubs, sports, scholarships, and leadership positions.

A statement on college or career plans.

A brief statement on why you want to be the Central Region or Area Boatswain.

ACTION: Each council wishing to nominate a Sea Scout should approve and forward the nomination form to the Central Region Sea Scout Commodore for the Service Committee for a regional position or the Area Sea Scout Commodore for the Service Team for an area position.

The selection by the Regional Sea Scout Service Committee or Team will take place by October 1, of the previous year.

TERM OF OFFICE: The Area or Regional Sea Scout Boatswain or Boatswain's Mate January to June 30 and July 1 to December 31 (two terms 1 year)
