What is Kodiak?

Kodiak is a leadership training course designed for Venturers and older Boy Scouts. It's composed of five basic leadership concepts: effective team; values and vision; communication; decision making; and planning. These leadership concepts are turned into the five commissions taught throughout the course. The course is designed to be taught during a weeklong high adventure trek. Courses have been taught across the nation from Philmont, to high adventure Colorado treks, to local event in your own hometown.

Kodiak expands the participant's knowledge of leadership as it applies to their Crew and other groups outside of Scouting.

Kodiak is definitely not your sit down and learn training course.

The participants learn the five commissions along with fun exercises throughout the week.

Kodiak treks aren't just for the youth. The adults in the Crew can join in and grow their understanding of their leadership roles in the Crew. All together, the course helps grow future leaders in the community as



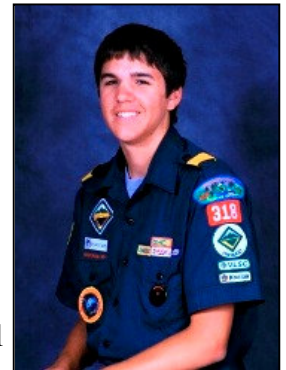

it helps them strengthen their roles in Scouts, school, and beyond.

(Sarah's Kodiak Trek in 2007 was a 2 3-day weekends "A Winter Tour of Our Town". She has also completed Kodiak X. She has completed the Kodiak/Kodiak X Course Director Course. She has staffed 2 Kodiaks in just the past month (One at Philmont and the other at Swift Base in southern Missouri).



It is designed to provide your council the building blocks to build success for your Council's Venturing Program. This one-day conference is designed to help you get Venturing "Out of the Box, and Over the Top" in your council. Whether you are just starting to build a Council Venturing structure, you are already on the path to success, or you just want to learn more information about how other councils have succeeded, then this conference is for you.

This conference is happening for the 12 councils in Area 3 of the Central Region. Guess what...that is your council! It will be held on January 30, 2010. Just in time for the 100th Anniversary of Scouting. Let's make that year all the more memorable for the youth in your council's Venturing Program by giving them the opportunity to grow in leadership skills, and have a great time doing it.

Practicing and mastering these skills will help enable Venturers to have positive leadership experiences in every facet of Scouting and life. It does not matter the type of activities a particular Crew has chosen, this is a leadership skills building course that all potential youth leaders should take to help shape their leadership styles. VLSC is a requirement for the youth to earn the Venturing Silver Award, it is a suggested course for any Venturer interested in participating on a Kodiak Trek, and is a requirement for the Advisor to earn the Advisors Award of Merit. VLSC is a required course for the new National Youth Leadership Society!



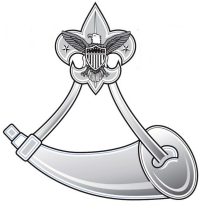

What is Powder Horn?



Powder Horn is a training opportunity designed to expose the Venturing or Boy Scout leader to activities and resources necessary to operate a successful Venturing Ranger Award or Troop High

Adventure program. It does this in several ways. First it helps Venturing Leaders and Scouters to safely conduct outdoor activities of a fun and challenging nature. It provides an introduction to the resources necessary to successfully lead Venturers and older Boy Scouts through a program of high adventure. And it familiarizes the Advisor with the Ranger program so that he or she can help the Venturer to meet the requirements of the Ranger Award. This course is based on the Venturing Ranger requirements giving participants an exposure to outdoor/high adventure activities. Scout leaders will also benefit from this course when your unit participates in unit high adventure.

Kodiak X Leadership Course Offered in CR Area 3

If you have completed Kodiak leadership course, your next step in leadership development is Kodiak X. Kodiak X is a weekend leadership challenge course that builds on the 5 leadership commissions learned in Kodiak. During the weekend, participants will review what they learned at Kodiak, and learn two additional commissions. These commissions are:

1. Evaluating Performance
2. Mentoring

Each participant will have an opportunity to practice their leadership skills while serving as a leader of their team as they face challenging scenarios.

The New Horizon District of the Greater St. Louis Area Council is sponsoring Kodiak X. The course's Co-Directors are Amanda Vogt, the 2008-2009 National Venturing President, and Bob Vogt, Central Region Area 3 Venturing Chair. Course will be held on September 25-26, 2009 at Salem in Ballwin United Methodist Church (14825 Manchester Rd, Ballwin, MO 63021) starting at 6:00pm. It will conclude on Saturday at 5:00pm. Participants will be staying at the church overnight. Co-ed adult leadership will be provided. Showers are available. Cost is \$25 and includes 2 meals, snacks, and course supplies. Course is limited to the first 48 paid participants. Course is open to Venturers from outside the council. Venturers, older Boy Scouts (15 & older) and adult leaders that have completed Kodiak can take Kodiak X. **See attached flyer & reservation form for more details.**

Five Kodiak Treks Done in 18 Months by One Crew

Venturing Crew 2783 from Ballwin, MO has completed 5 Kodiak treks in the past 18 months. Over 50 Venturers and adults have completed the leadership training on these treks. The Crew has 4 members that have completed the Kodiak Course Director Course. The first trek was in January 2008 and was "A Winter Tour our Town" trek. Held over 2 weekends, the participants' activities ranged from downhill skiing to winter hikes.

Trek two was in June 2008 and was to Colorado. Activities ranged from mountain biking Pikes Peak, whitewater rafting the Royal Gorge, climbing Mt. Yale (14000' +), to horseback riding through the Rocky's.

Trek three and four were in June 2009 as they had 2 crews at Philmont doing Kodiak along the trail.

And trek five was done just 2 weeks ago at the high adventure base for Venturing in southern Missouri called Swift Base.

Crew 2783 coordinated for the Greater St. Louis Area Council its first Kodiak X in April 2008 and is coordinating the council's 2nd Kodiak X this September. **Details on this Kodiak X are attached to this Venturing Update.**
