First National Venturing Event – Right Here in Area 3



The Venturing Officer Association of the Greater St. Louis Area Council is proud to announce that the Fall Fun Rally has been designated as the first National Venturing Event. The council is proud to sponsor this event and to open it up to Venturers from across the country to attend.

The Fall Fun Rally is the largest Venturing event held each year in the country. The Fall Fun Rally is in its 37th year. We have the facilities, the staff, and the experience to host several thousand Venturers for this 3-day event. In 2008 it was the Central Region's 10th Anniversary event for Venturing. Venturers from throughout the Central Region attended. This event is centrally located in the USA.

The Fall Fun Rally is a youth lead event. The Council's V.O.A., the 9 District V.O.As, and hundreds of other Venturers staff the event each year. Venturing is many things, but of uppermost importance is youth leadership development. Planning for the 2010 event started at last year's event. This is the first time that a National Venturing event is being done and it is the youth of the Venturing program that are doing it. We are honored to take on this endeavor. We thank our council and

the National Office for the trust they have placed in us to accomplish this unique opportunity. We hope that this will be the start of more and bigger future National Venturing Events, but today's good news is that the first one is on the way. So let's get excited about it!

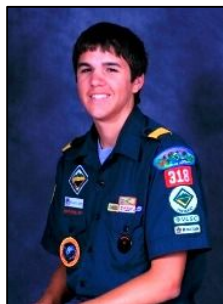

lifetime opportunity to become a National Venturing Officer. We need your help to identify qualifying Venturing youth in Area 3 that are ready to step-up in their leadership. Applications are due to the Central Region Office by March 15th

Qualifications: To run for Regional Venturing President, a Venturer must:

1. Be a present or past crew president, or a present or past Council Venturing Officer Association President or officer (or equivalent district/council/Area organization) in his or her council.
2. Be recommended and approved by his or her council.
3. Be less than 20 years of age on May 31, 2010.
4. Be a currently primary registered Venturer in his or her council.
5. Be able to attend the BSA National Annual Meeting the weekend of May 26-29
6. Be able to attend the National Venturing Youth Cabinet Training and Orientation in Irving, TX from July 7-11

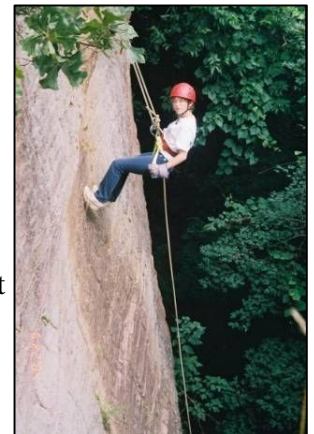
Swift Base – A Venturing Paradise

Swift Base first opened the summer of 1966 at S bar F Scout Ranch about 90 miles south of St. Louis. From the beginning, it was designed to be a totally different experience for high-school and college-age members. It is one of only two bases of its type in our country. And we are lucky to have it here in Area 3.



S bar F Scout Ranch is 5,200 acres of woods, trails, streams, Nims Lake and fun. The 270-acre Nims Lake serves as the focal point for water skiing, sailing, fishing, canoeing, swimming, water tubing, sun bathing, kayaking and water sliding. A herd of horses will allow you to saddle-up and explore the wilderness trails. If heights and challenges are your thing, Swift offers rock climbing, rappelling and a high and low ropes course. Mountain bikes are available every day for rides that see no pavement. You may want to try your hand at firing a .22 rifle or bow and arrow. At Swift, you choose what you want to do.

Evening programs include campfires and dances, volleyball and crazy competitions. We plan for an outdoor movie night, drive-in style. A game night or bonfire may be in the offing. If your crew wants to take an overnight canoe float down the lake, that can be arranged. Some crews like to hike to Castle Rock to check out the stars.



All meals are served in Swift Lodge -- dining-hall style. You camp on a campsite with your crew and your leaders. Tents are set up for you on wooden frames. Each of our five campsites are scattered in the woods, so that you have shade and some privacy.

RESERVE YOUR SPOT AT SWIFT BASE

Venturers should start making plans for the 2010 summer camp program at Swift Base. The sign-up process is based on a first-come, first-served basis. High-school-age Scouts from the Greater St. Louis

Area Council and out-of-council crews may begin signing up to attend Swift Base now.

Adventure Base 100 in Area 3

Experience Scouting like never before with **Adventure Base 100!** Created specifically for the 100th Anniversary Celebration, Adventure Base 100 is traveling the country to give people an exciting, hands-on view of the history and future of the Boy Scouts of America. This 10,000 square foot campus features immersive Scouting experiences including a ropes course and zip line, interactive digital exhibits, a multi-sensory IMAX-like dome, and more! It will also house a traveling museum that will showcase real artifacts from the National Scouting Museum in Irving, TX. Starting at the Tournament of Roses Parade in Pasadena, Calif. in January, and ending at the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade in New York in November, this magnificent traveling exhibit will stop at key events and locations in more than 40 cities including 2 locations here in Area 3. They are Cedar Rapids, IA on June 18-19 and St. Louis, MO on August 21-22.

The Value of Leadership

The heart and soul of what we do in the Boy Scouts of America is to produce leaders for tomorrow. One of our strengths is shaping leaders who have a strong foundation of values and who know how to serve others, and we have had 100 years of practice. Now, as we begin to celebrate that rich century of leadership development, we introduce the National Youth Leadership Society.



Its purpose is to recognize youth members of the BSA who have learned and practiced outstanding leadership skills—the elite of our program. We want these youths, who have worked so hard at learning and leading, to enjoy a form of recognition that other organizations, such as schools, colleges, employers, and the military, can understand and value. Youths inducted into this National Youth Leadership Society may now receive the recognition they deserve in a more tangible way.

As a national leadership society, the National Youth Leadership Society calls upon local councils to nominate those individuals who meet certain criteria. Upon acceptance, the National Court of Honor will offer the individual the honor of membership into the Society. The council will be sent the appropriate honors and will perform a formal induction.

The National Court of Honor will maintain a national honor roll of inducted Society members as a class each calendar year. Individuals will be able to say they are a member of a particular class, for instance, the class of 2010 for members inducted in 2010. The class is based on when the individual was approved, not when the induction took place.

What is Powder Horn?

Powder Horn is a training opportunity designed to expose the Venturing or Boy Scout leader to activities and resources necessary to operate a successful Venturing Ranger Award or Troop High Adventure program.



It does this in several ways. First it helps Venturing Leaders and Scouters to safely conduct outdoor activities of a fun and challenging nature. It provides an introduction to the resources necessary to successfully lead Venturers and older Boy Scouts through a program of high adventure. And it familiarizes the Advisor with the Ranger program so that he or she can help the Venturer to meet the requirements of the Ranger Award. This course is based on the Venturing Ranger requirements giving participants an exposure to outdoor/high adventure activities. Scout leaders will also benefit from this course when your unit participates in unit high adventure.

Area 3 Venturing Conference

The first ever Area 3 Venturing Conference was “Out of the Box and Over the Top”. 64 participants and 10 staff spent January 30th in Normal, IL learning how to take their council’s Venturing program to the next level. Led by Sarah Ward, Area 3 Venturing President, and Amanda Vogt, past National Venturing President, the conference was packed full of valuable Venturing knowledge and experience.



Representatives from 12 councils (7 states) were in attendance. Topics covered everything from basic Venturing to advance leadership opportunities, from how to lead a multi-crew event in your council to the ultimate multi-crew youth lead event (National Venturing Event). The importances of Kodiak and Powder Horn courses were explained. The development of council and district Venturing Officer Associations as key to developing a council Venturing program were deeply discussed. Even to the point of demonstrating mock VOA elections.

All of the participants were encouraged to take the foundation knowledge they gained from the conference and build upon it within their council for the benefit of the Venturing youth.
