## What is Powder Horn?

Powder Horn is a training opportunity designed to expose the Venturing or Boy Scout leader to activities and resources necessary to operate a successful Venturing Ranger Award or Troop High Adventure program.

It does this in several ways. First it helps Venturing Leaders and Scouters to safely conduct outdoor activities of a fun and challenging nature. It provides an introduction to the resources necessary to successfully lead Venturers and older Boy Scouts through a program of high adventure. And it familiarizes the Advisor with the Ranger program so that he or she can help the Venturer to meet the requirements of the Ranger Award. This course is based on the Venturing Ranger requirements giving participants an exposure to outdoor/high adventure activities. Scout leaders will also benefit from this course when your unit participates in unit high adventure.

## Seabadge to be Offered in Area 3

## Venturers Lead the Way at ScoutQuest 100

In St. Louis, MO from June 4-6<sup>th</sup> well over 20,000 Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts, and



Venturers attended ScoutQuest 100 in Forest Park. The Greater St. Louis Area Council sponsored the event (expected to only be exceeded by the Jamboree in Scout attendance for the 100th Anniversary Year). The Lewis & Clark Council was also a participant in this huge event.

Venturing was well represented at the event. Hundreds of Venturers participated. The Venturers organized and lead 5 of the most popular events. The Venturing lead events were Ice Block Sledding, Slacklining, Extreme Obstacle Course, Cardboard Boat Race and Fencing (lead by a Fencing Crew from the Lewis & Clark Council).



The Ice Block Sledding was a big hit. It is estimated that over 10,000 Scouts tried their hands at balancing themselves on a large block of ice as the sledged their way down a long hill.

Slacklining is like tightrope walking, except you are only about 2 feet off the ground.

Nearly a dozen slacklines were kept very busy over the 3-day event.



The Extreme Obstacle Course was a big draw especially for the Cub Scouts. They had to negotiate many different and challenging elements as they made their way around the course.



The Milstadt Venturing Crew hosted the Fencing event. Scouts were given the opportunity to try out the sport under the watchful eye of the experienced Venturer Fencers.



Then came the wild and wet Cardboard Boat Race. 37 Crews and Troops entered the



event. Most did not make it to the finish line. TV cameras from the local media caught the highlights of the race.

## **BSA Joins with Duke of Edinburgh's Award Program to Inspire Youth Across America**

**IRVING, TX (May 20, 2010)**—The Boy Scouts of America (BSA) and the Duke of Edinburgh's Award program announced today a new collaboration to promote the Young Americans' Challenge to youth members of the BSA. The award program aims to involve youth in challenging educational and nonacademic programs in community service, adventurous journeys, and physical recreation activities to achieve a balanced development of life skills.

BSA Chief Scout Executive Bob Mazzuca and His Royal Highness Prince Edward, Earl of Wessex, officially launched the program nationwide during a special reception at the National Scouting Museum. During the event, the two discussed the complementary efforts of both organizations to strengthen communities, families, and young people. "It isn't every day that we have the occasion to welcome royalty, but this very special visit does highlight the everyday commitment we share with Prince Edward to enrich the lives of young people," Mazzuca said. "The Young Americans' Challenge provides yet another opportunity for our nation's youth to fulfill their potential. We are excited to offer it to our membership."

The award, introduced to the United Kingdom in 1956 by Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh, has since traveled to more than 130 countries around the world, inspiring youth (ages 14 to 25) to achieve personal discovery and growth through self-reliance, perseverance, responsibility, and service to the community. Every year, there are approximately 700,000 youth worldwide who undertake these programs of development in order to achieve either a bronze, silver, or gold level of achievement. Since 1956, more than six million awards have been presented.

Although the award will be available to all Scouts, the BSA will specifically promote it to members of its Venturing program. Venturing is a youth development program for young men and women between the ages of 14 and 21. The program provides positive experiences to help young people mature and to prepare them to become responsible and caring adults.

## **BSA, Duke of Edinburgh's Award**

"The Boy Scouts of America is a wonderful organization that has inspired America's youth for 100 years," said Prince Edward, Earl of Wessex. "We believe that this award is a great addition to their already exceptional program of motivating young people to achieve great things."

For a century, the BSA has helped build the future leaders of America by combining educational activities and lifelong values with the inspiration required to ignite action. It has remained the nation's leading youth organization through its dedication to the core values of Scouting—service to others, personal achievement, and respecting and embracing the outdoors—while continuously adapting to new technologies and communication platforms to help deliver its programs in relevant and meaningful ways
