



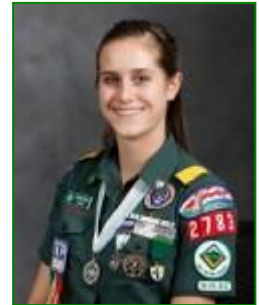

What is Powder Horn?

Powder Horn is a training opportunity designed to expose the Venturing or Boy Scout leader to activities and resources necessary to operate a successful Venturing Ranger Award or Troop High Adventure program.

It does this in several ways. First it helps Venturing Leaders and Scouters to safely conduct outdoor activities of a fun and challenging nature. It provides an introduction to the resources necessary to successfully lead Venturers and older Boy Scouts through a program of high adventure. And it familiarizes the Advisor with the Ranger program so that he or she can help the Venturer to meet the requirements of the Ranger Award. This course is based on the Venturing Ranger requirements giving participants an exposure to outdoor/high adventure activities. Scout leaders will also benefit from this course when your unit participates in unit high adventure.

The Central Region Area 3 is proud to announce the completion and adoption of the Area 3 Venturing Operating Procedures. We believe that CR Area 3 is the first Area in the nation to have Operating Procedures in place. The replace the previous Area By-laws and conform to the National Standard Operating Procedures.

The Operating Procedures set forth the methods that the Area 3 Venturing Officers' Association will be operating under. The procedures were youth developed by the Area 3 Venturing Officers' and were reviewed in conciliation with Dan Cariveau, National Venturing President; Dustin Readenour, CR Venturing President; and Amanda Vogt, Past National Venturing President. Fred Wallace, Area 3 Director and the Deputy Regional Director have approved them. They were affective on July 1, 2011.

Sea Scouting has been included in these Operating Procedures as their positions fit within the Area 3 Venturing Officers' Association. The Operating Procedures will give us a structure to follow now with ability to amend them in the future as needs and situations change. Venturing and JROTC Program

Hi, I am Whitfield A. Montgomery the Central Region Area 3 Venturing Vice President of Program. As Commander of Venturing U.S Army Junior ROTC Crew 2023 and the Central Region Area 3 VP of Program, I am working to promote the Venturing program and JROTC working together. The national JROTC-Army and Navy have partnership agreements with the Boy Scouts of America with the idea to utilize the Venturing program to bring these two programs together and share resources. However this partnership has not been utilized to the best of its ability. That is why it has become one of my goals to promote this concept.



This concept will take lots of leadership and meetings with the U.S Army Cadet Command, and therefore will not happen overnight. So I am asking the help of all of the Council Venturing Vice Presidents of Program to help promote Venturing in your Junior R.O.T.C areas to establish more units working together, and then we can approach the Cadet Command about promoting this opportunity on a larger scale.

The Boy Scouts of America have a list of mutual benefits of these two programs working together available at http://www.scouting.org/filestore/pdf/19_JROTCarmy.pdf, but in the meantime here are some good reasons for approaching this project from the Venturing side of the program:

- The Junior R.O.T.C Program will increase the Venturing membership numbers across the Nation. (My Crew alone has over 200 members.)
- The Junior R.O.T.C program will bring more youth with leadership skills to Venturing as these skills are very important to the JROTC program.
- This will expand the opportunities for more camping trips on and off military bases for existing Venturers
- It will help both Junior ROTC and Venturing motivate young adults to become better citizens in their communities.

Central Region's First National Advanced Youth Leadership Experience (N.A.Y.L.E.) To Be Held Here in Area 3

Location: S Bar F Scout Ranch - 90 Minutes south of St. Louis, Missouri

Date: July 31 - August 4, 2011 (Depart on August 5 before 8am)

What is N.A.Y.L.E.?

The N.A.Y.L.E. program is an advanced version of National Youth Leadership Training (N.Y.L.T.). It is designed to provide you with a backcountry-based wilderness encounter that applies and internalizes the skills learned at your Council-level National Youth Leadership Training Course, and motivates you to follow a life of servant leadership by helping others succeed, based on Scouting's values.



Who is it for and what are the requirements?

This program is for Boy Scouts, Varsity Scouts, Venturers and Sea Scouts.

The requirements are:

- ◆ You must be currently registered and active in your Scouting program
- ◆ You must have completed Unit-Level Youth Leader Training
- ◆ Be a minimum of 14 years of age before the first day of the course
- ◆ Boy Scouts and Varsity Scouts: Not yet 18 years of age, and have completed NYLT
- ◆ Venturers and Sea Scouts: Not yet 21 years of age, and have completed NYLT if available in your Council (or have completed the NYLT to NAYLE Bridge Course if NYLT is not available)
- ◆ Be physically fit and approved for High Adventure on your current 2011 BSA Medical Form

What will I gain from this experience?

N.A.Y.L.E. equips youth leaders to be better Troop, Team, Crew, or Ship Leaders, NYLT Staff Members, and/or superior Camp Staff members. It will help guide your journey in leadership service to others, will enable you to develop all members of whatever

teams you lead, and will provide important life skills for now and the future.

What does the course include?

- ◆ Advanced Team-Building Skills
- ◆ Geocaching
- ◆ Wilderness First Aid
- ◆ Search and Rescue
- ◆ Leave No Trace camping Skills
- ◆ Conservation
- ◆ Future Leadership Opportunities in Scouting

How much is the program?

The N.A.Y.L.E. Program cost is \$355.00, payable in full with registration. This fee covers meals, lodging, training materials, a N.A.Y.L.E. uniform cap, and 2 N.A.Y.L.E. uniform t-shirts. Participants are responsible for personal and camping gear. Detailed information, Packing List, and Leadership Survey will be provided upon registration.
