This one-day conference is designed to help you get Venturing "Out of the Box and Over the Top". Whether you are just starting to grow your crew or Venturing Officer Association structure or you are already on the path to success and you just want to learn more information about how others have succeeded, then this conference is for you. This conference is for professional Scouters, Venturing adult leaders and Venturing youth leaders ready to take the next step up in Venturing.

This conference is for the 11 councils in Area 3 of the Central Region, but others from around the nation are certainly welcomed. Let's make 2012 all the more memorable for the youth in Venturing by giving them the opportunity to grow in leadership skills, and have a great time doing it.

The Fall Fun Rally Review!

The 2011 Fall Fun Rally was a “Blast”! This year the Fall Fun Rally wasn't a National Event as it was in 2010, but the attendance and the activities sure made it feel like one. 1,174 participants attended the Fall Fun Rally. This will be the largest gathering of Venturers likely this year too, with 1,017 Venturers, Sea Scouts and Adults in attendance. It wasn't a bad attendance of nearly 60 Explorers either. People

from 12 states and 27 councils came from as far away as Virginia.

Participants were constantly busy with activities to do from Climbing Wall, Tricycle Jostling, Shooting Sports, Squeeze Box, Mud Caving, Bikeathlon, Fencing, Medieval Combat, Mountain Men, Slacklining, Sea Scouts and much much more. There were over 100 activities for participants to participate in over the weekend.

National Youth Leadership Society Induction

This year at the Fall Fun Rally four youth were inducted into the National Youth Leadership Society. To submit a nomination form for this society a youth must have completed multiple leadership courses including one of the following: the Troop Junior Leader Training, the Venturing Leadership Skills Course, or the newer Introduction to Leadership Skills for Crews or Troops. From there the youth must complete three of the following courses: Kodiak, Kodiak X, NYLT, or NAYLE. From there the youth must demonstrate the leadership skills they have learned by holding leadership positions.

The nomination form is then submitted to your council office for approval. The council then forwards the form to the National BSA Office for approval with \$100. The nominee, the unit, or the council can pay this fee. This fee covers the framed certificate, the necklace or lapel pin feature the society logo, and a membership card. The National Council will then send your Council all of the recognition items to be presented at an appropriate location.

The four youth inducted at the Fall Fun Rally this year were: Dustin Readenour, the Central Region Venturing President; Christina Vogt, the Central Region Area 3 Venturing President; Hannah Bisch, the Greater St. Louis Area Council VOA President; and Samantha Yahl, a past District VOA Officer, Area 3 Venturing Vice President and the Co-Chair for this year's Fall Fun Rally. What is Powder Horn?

Powder Horn is a training opportunity designed to expose the Venturing or Boy Scout leader to activities and resources necessary to operate a successful Venturing Ranger Award or Troop High Adventure program.



It does this in several ways. First it helps Venturing Leaders and Scouters to safely conduct outdoor activities of a fun and challenging nature. It provides an introduction to the resources necessary to successfully lead Venturers and older Boy Scouts through a program of high adventure. And it familiarizes the Advisor with the Ranger program so that he or she can help the Venturer to meet the requirements of the Ranger Award. This course is based on the Venturing Ranger requirements giving participants an exposure to outdoor/high adventure activities. Scout leaders will also benefit from this course when your unit participates in unit high adventure.

Central Illinois Powder Horn

Did you know that Area 3 had one Powder Horn course this year? And guess what, it was an experience. The Central Illinois Powder Horn hosted by the W.D. Boyce Council was a BLAST!!



On a hot summer day in August, the spies came out at Powder Horn in Peoria. Friday began with Low COPE activities, shooting sports, and then learning to cook with style with Don Jacobson. For the evening program, we traveled to Paris, and took part in an exciting

Casino Royale murder mystery. (And that was all in the first day!) The rest of the weekend went along in a similar manner of jam packed fun. Saturday was filled with Water activities of Canoeing, Kayaking, and Fishing in the Illinois River. The jumping carp that have invaded the Illinois River made an appearance for many of the participants taking in the experience. If the participants were not doing those activities, they were out Sailing with the Sea Scouts or doing Wakeboarding. The youth participants really



enjoyed the Wakeboarding activity. Wakeboarding is when you strap on a snowboard-like board and get towed behind the boat and hold on for the excitement. Our Central Region Vice President of Administration, Sarah, got out there and made wakeboarding look easy. On Sunday, the participants did a round robin of activities of First Aid, Emergency Preparedness, Hunting and even a Police Demonstration.

The second weekend was just as great as the first weekend! It started on September 9th and included an old Wild West experience. After spending a day



around the horses, learning more about conservation, plants and animals, and navigating our way through the land, we all settled around the fire for some grub while also getting a chance to ride the steel drum bull



(something you just had to see), blacksmithing and swapping stories. Dan Carriveau, the National Venturing President, spent the weekend with us just to see the type of fun Powder Horn entails. The rest of the second weekend was more round robin activities of Living History, Winter Camping, Leave No

Trace, Wilderness Survival and much more.

In 2012, Area 3 will be holding another Powder Horn course. Greater St. Louis Area Council will be holding a Powder Horn course on April 20-22 and May 4-6, 2012. The fee is \$250 per participant. A \$50 non-refundable deposit is required along with your completed and signed registration form to reserve your spot in the course. Slots are limited to the first 48 participants (40 adults and 8 youths, 16 years and older). We currently have over 60% of the slots filled as of 10/01/2011. Applications are accepted on a first come, first reserved basis. A deposit must be received to reserve your space.

The Central Region Area 3 is proud to announce the completion and adoption of the Area 3 Venturing Operating Procedures. We believe that CR Area 3 is the first Area in the nation to have Operating Procedures in place. The replace the previous Area By-laws and conform to the National Standard Operating Procedures.

The Operating Procedures set forth the methods that the Area 3 Venturing Officers' Association will be operating under. The procedures were youth developed by the Area 3 Venturing Officers' and were reviewed in conciliation with Dan Carriveau, National Venturing President; Dustin Readenour, CR Venturing President; and Amanda Vogt, Past National Venturing President. Fred Wallace, Area 3 Director and the Deputy Regional Director have approved them. They were affective on July 1, 2011.

Sea Scouting has been included in these Operating Procedures as their positions fit within the Area 3 Venturing Officers' Association. The Operating Procedures will give us a structure to follow now with ability to amend them in the future as needs and situations change.
