

Venturing Awards

The theme this month is awards. There are several types of recognition available to youth, leaders, and councils.

For all youth in Venturing, the Bronze, Gold, and Silver Awards recognize goal-setting, skill development, and meeting challenges. To further develop their skills and interests, they can earn the Ranger, Trust, and the Quest award. Ranger focuses on outdoor and high adventure. The Trust award focuses on your faith life and learning about other religions. Quest is for those dedicated to sports and physical fitness.

Finally, Sea Scouts can earn the Quartermaster to grow in nautical skill level and leadership.

The Venturing Leadership Award is available at the local council, area, regional, and national level to recognize

outstanding leadership in Venturing. Until the end of the year, the councillevel award will be available to adults in Venturing, and beginning January 1st, 2012, the VLA will only be awarded to youth. Summit Test Run

Do you and your crew want to play an important role in helping with the final planning process for the 2013 National Jamboree? Summit is calling for crews and troops to come out for a long weekend to camp and experience some of the activities that are available out at the Summit. SBR wants to test various components of the new jamboree model on-site. This will be a great opportunity for the youth already planning to attend the 2013 Jamboree as they will be able to experience the Summit in advance.

The cost of the event covers all meals beginning with the lunch on the day of arrival and will end with the breakfast of the day of departure. This also covers tents, equipment, supplies, and other items similar to the items that will be provided for at the jamboree. To find out the cost for your crew or troop, head out on to the crventuring.org.

Everyone should only bring out their personal gear; this

Some of the possible programs are climbing, rappelling, canopy tour, zip lines, ВМХ, skateboarding, mountain biking, archery. shooting sports, and Activities that will be present are primarily new to the Summit jamboree model and not intended to represent the entire program elements offered in 2013.
