Area 3 Venturing Conference Just a few days away!



It is the goal of the Area 3 Venturing Officer Association to have trained leaders, youth with leadership experience, a great program, successful membership growth and retention, and more. The annual Area 3 Venturing Conference is the place to come and help us make this possible. It will be happening January 11th-12th, 2013. The majority of the conference will take place on Saturday the 12th with a few training courses occurring on Friday night. Introduction to Leadership Skills for Crews will take place on Friday night for any youth wishing to attend and learn how to become a better leader. Adult Basic Trainings and Venturing Leadership Specific Training will also take place on Friday night for the adults in attendance. These courses will begin at 5:30pm and will end around 10:00pm. If you wish to stay overnight, participants will be able to sleep at the church. Check-in will begin on January 11th at 5:30pm and again at 7:45am on January 12th. The conference is hosted by Area 3 and is not a specific council event. It is held at Calvary United Methodist Church in Normal, Illinois. You need to register as soon as possible to hold your spot. The cost for the 2013 Conference is \$20 up until the conference date. The charge will cover all materials and conference costs. Lunch will also be provided. It covers topics such as Crew/Ship organization, planning, effective communication, and servant leadership, to name just a few! Split into three modules, it can be presented in several different settings and time frames. For example, each module could be presented at a separate crew meeting, or it could be done all at once during a morning or afternoon. Don't let the term 'training' keep you from the course! While it has some lecture-like moments, it is mostly chocked full of games and activities! It is a prerequisite for National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT), so sign up for a course near you today! There will be a course happening at the Area 3 Venturing Conference on January 11th.




With snow on the ground, or at least cooler temperatures that allow us to pull out coats, mittens, and scarves, it is hard to turn our thoughts to summer plans. However, it is that time of year when it is time to sign up for summer camps! Swift Base offers three weeks of Venturing summer camp, each with a different theme. The first week is the Aquatics Extravaganza. It will bring adventures full of fly fishing, boat races, and boats so big you do not sail them – you crew them! The second week is all about Shooting Sports and STEM. If you like to shoot guns, this week is most definitely for you! It will include the opportunity to shoot guns you have likely never shot at a scout camp before! There will also be visiting scientists and engineers to give you a taste of the new Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics program. Finally, the third week will be the Great Outdoors. Have you ever gone climbing in pitch black darkness? How about creating your own shelter and finding your own food? This week is themed around climbing, rappelling, caving, and wilderness survival, may even bring the opportunities to evade some zombies! In addition to all of the activities for each themed week, Swift will still offer the typical activities, including horseback riding, water tubing, water skiing, COPE, standup paddle boarding, slacklining, and much more! 


Now that the Central Region Area 3 Venturing Officers' Association has created several videos, it is your turn to star in one! Each council has the opportunity to create their own video to be entered into a contest. All submission must be received by April 30, 2013 to qualify. 1. Each council may only submit one video.
2. The video must be a recruitment video.
3. It must be at least one minute in length, but no more than five minutes.
4. Pictures, videos, drawings, etc. are all encouraged as long as they come from your council. (They must also be legal and Scout appropriate!)
5. Youth and adults are encouraged to debut in the video. However, overall, there should be more youth than adults, as the program is youth led.
6. Please reference www.beascout.org to help prospective Scouts find a unit close to them.
7. Videos must be uploaded to the Central Region Area 3 Facebook group and the Venturing, BSA group no later than April 30, 2013.

ADVANCEMENT OF THE MONTH



Religious Life Bronze

Required Requirements: 9 out of 11

Estimated time: 3 months

Though it takes a while to complete the Religious Bronze, there are a few things that you could do (or start to do) to complete it this month, or in the month to come.

This month you could:

Diversity!

~ Learn about cultural diversity, and then make a presentation. (This satisfies Requirement 2a and 2b)

Cultural Differences!

~ Bring a culturally different guest to a crew meeting, and have a cultural discussion, and then participate in one of these discussions that isn't yours. (This satisfies Requirements 2c and 2d. You can do either 2a and 2b or 2c and 2d)

Service!

~ Plan and lead a service project.

~ Examples include Habitat for Humanity, community cleanup, nursing home/nursery project.

~ This satisfies Requirement 3a.

Volunteering!

~ This requires a total of three months, but it's never too soon to start!

~ Volunteer for a nonprofit organization, or a church or synagogue.

~ Keep a journal of your findings and share experiences.

~ These things satisfy Requirements 4a and 4b.

Retreat!

~ Go on a religious retreat or trek lasting 2 or more days. (This satisfies requirement 5)

Youth Leadership!

~ Serve as president, leader, or officer of your Sunday school class or youth group. (This satisfies Requirement 7)

Ethics!

~ Participate in 2 ethical controversies.

~ Facilitate 2 ethical controversies.

~ Lead an ethics forum for a youth group.

~ These satisfy Requirements 9a, 9b, and 9c.

Teach!

~ Serve as a Sunday School teacher or assistant for 3 months OR Volunteer for a children's activity or Vacation Bible School. (This satisfies requirement 10)

Meet!

~ Meet with your church/synagogue minister/rabbi/leader and find out what they do, and what is the most important part of their job. (This satisfies requirement 11)

As always, these things are subject to change at the discretion of your advisor.

What is stealth advancement?

Stealth advancement is completing requirements without even knowing.

Advisors and presidents, how can you help your crew to achieve stealth advancement?

- Incorporate requirements with activities
- Allow youth to plan events
- After events, sit down and look at the requirements you have completed.
