Venue:

“Nairamdal” International Children’s Center, Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia



Participant:

The Jamboree is open to Scouts aged 12-17 years old, male and female who are registered as member of their National Scout Organization and their leaders.

International Service Team:

Interested and qualified Scout Leaders are welcome to be part of the International Service Team.

Jamboree fee:

Participant: USD 200 and it will cover food, local transportation from the airport to the Jamboree site, participant’s kit.

IST: USD 180 and it will cover food, local transportation from the airport to the Jamboree site, participant’s kit.

Day visitor: USD 50 and it will cover lunch, Jamboree souvenir.

Plan your Trip:

Chinggis Khaan International Airport will be the main points of entry by air. You can also arrive Ulaanbaatar Station by train. Plan your trip reach to in Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia by direct flight from Istanbul (Turkey), Berlin and Frankfurt (Germany), Paris (France), Moscow (Russia), Seoul (Korea), Osaka and Tokyo (Japan), Hong Kong and Beijing (China) and train from Moscow (Trans Siberian Train) and Beijing.

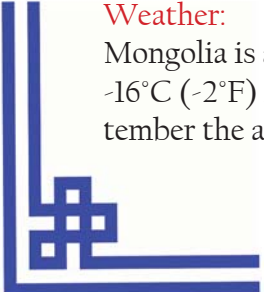
Visa:

All participants should obtain an entry visa before traveling to Mongolia from the Mongolian Embassy or Consulate in most capital cities. Visas may also be obtained upon arrival at the Mongolian border or international airport. The Scout Association of Mongolia will provide invitation letter.



Weather:

Mongolia is a land of temperature extremes. The average annual temperature in Mongolia ranges from -16°C (-2°F) in February to a more comfortable 16°C (62°F) in July. Summer fades quickly, and by September the annual average temperature drops to 8°C (48°F)





Jamboree Programme:

The 31st Asia Pacific Regional Scout Jamboree program highlights are a chance to Mongolian and overseas participants to exchange their experiences and to let scouts learn about Mongolian culture and history. There will be various kinds of interesting activities organized every day.

We would like to give everyone as much opportunity as possible to meet people from other cultures and from the local community, as well as to enable them to participate in interesting and stimulating activities.



Scout Centre:

It will be centre for learning and improving your skill of Pioneering, craft workshops, hiking around resort area, mountain trail encircling the jamboree and orienteering. Also providing opportunity to practice friendship and become Messenger of Peace.

Nomadic Centre:

In this center you will have an opportunity to introduce with specific about Mongolian nomadic lifestyle. Nomadic life thrives in summer and survives in winter. Considering climatic conditions, especially during winter, such lifestyle may seem to the outside world to be a very hard way of living. Also you will have an opportunity to play traditional games, songs and dances. Traditional games such as ankle bone, archery and putting up a Mongolian ger, riding a horse and two-hump camel, and etc.

All participants will have a chance to take part in the traditional manly sports at Naadam Festival such as Wrestling, Archery and Horse racing.

The Global Development Village Centre

GDV will be an on-site module programme, which tries to raise awareness over global issues such as peace, environment, development, human rights and health allows participants to become active members of the global community through various exhibits, games, arts and audio-visual displays, discussions, and presentations.
